Shengdi Chen, M.D., Ph.D. is Professor and Chairman, Department of Neurology and Institute of Neurology, Ruijin Hospital affiliated to Shanghai Jiao Tong University School of Medicine, Shanghai, China. His main interests are in the epidemiology, pathogenesis, diagnosis and treatment of Parkinson's disease, Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.

He graduated from the Faculty of Medicine, Shanghai Jiao Tong University School of Medicine in 1978, and got M.D. & Ph.D. degrees of Neurology in 1978 and 1991, respectively. He was trained in lab research (1995-1996) and worked in clinical practice (2001) at the Department of Neurology, Baylor College of Medicine, Houston, USA as Postdoc, Visiting Scholar and Visiting Professor.

Since 1978, he has worked at the Department of Neurology, Ruijin Hospital, Shanghai Jiao Tong University School of Medicine, and held University appointments as a Chief-neurologist and Full Professor in 1994 and Chairman at Department of Neurology in 1997 until now.

He is currently Editor-in-Chief of *Translational Neurodegeneration*, Vice-Director of Chinese Society of Neurology, Chinese Medical Association (CMA); Vice-Director of Chinese Society for Neuroscience, Director of Chinese Parkinson's Disease & Movement Disorders Society; Past-Director of Shanghai Society of Neurology & Vice-Director of Shanghai Society of Geriatrics, CMA; member of the World Federation of Neurology (WFN) research committee on Parkinsonism and related disorders.

He has published more than 600 papers, editorials and reviews (including 190 SCI papers) and received 29 awards in the Parkinson's disease, Alzheimer's disease and Stroke studies as well as 43 grant supports.
