

Irena Rektorova, MD, Ph.D. is Professor of Neurology at the Department of Neurology, School of Medicine, Masaryk University, Brno, Czech Republic. She is Head of the Centre for Cognitive Impairment and Dementia at the Department of Neurology, St. Anne's Teaching Hospital, and Head of the Applied Neuroscience Research Group, Central European Institute of Technology, Masaryk University, Brno, Czech Republic. She graduated from the Medical Faculty, Charles University in Prague, Czech Republic, in 1994. She is a board-certified neurologist and her main interests lie in movement disorders and Parkinson's disease in particular, cognitive impairment and dementia, brain magnetic resonance imaging, and repetitive transcranial magnetic stimulation. She has published over 100 peer reviewed papers and book chapters and has been an invited speaker for many national and international meetings. She was a local organizer of the AD/PD conference in Prague, in 2009. She served on the board of the European Parkinson's Disease Association (EPDA) as a Project Liaison (1998-2001) and then as a Vice-president (2001-2004). She is a board member of the European Society for Clinical Neuropharmacology and a committee board member of several sections of the Czech Neurological Society including the Cognitive Neurology, Human brain Mapping and Movement Disorders Sections. She is a Secretary of the International Association of Parkinsonism and Related Disorders. IR serves as Associated Editor of BMC Neurology, and as member of the editorial board of the Czech journal Neurologie pro praxi, and of Brain Topography.
